Athletes of the Bible

ne of my favorite times of year is when we can watch some of the greatest athletes in the world compete at the highest level! Having played a few sports myself, I even more appreciate the skill, training, and dedication each athlete brings to the Olympic games.

The Bible is not absent of athletic people either, so I thought I would challenge myself to find the most athletic people in the Bible, those who show some sort of athletic aptitude. Let's start with the most crowded and contested competition first:

Marathon - There are multiple candidates for this hallmark Olympic event. Ahimaaz the son of Zadok is a serious competitor, as he has a strong reputation in 2 Samuel 18:27. So also is Asahel, Joab's brother, who is described as swift of foot, like a gazelle in the open field, or like a wild deer (2 Samuel 2:18) and also among the elite company of David's thirty valiant men (2 Samuel 23:24). The gold medal here, though, belongs to Elijah the Tishbite, who "gathered up his garment and ran before Ahab to the entrance of Jezreel." (1 Kings 18:46) Why is this the gold medal winner? Ahab was in his chariot and Elijah outran it!

Weightlifting - This list would be remiss without mentioning Samson, whose strength was unmatched, perhaps even to this day. The Rabbinic Midrash says that Samson was so strong that he could uplift two mountains and rub them together like two clods of earth (Midrash Leviticus Rabbah viii. 2). While that might not be accurate, we do know that in Judges 16, he displayed enough strength to break the two main supporting pillars in the Philistine temple, thereby delivering God's people.

Wrestling - This one goes to Jacob, who wrestled with God and dominated the match so much that God had to injure his hip on purpose to get out! I wonder what today's wrestling competition might have looked like against Jacob.

Check out Genesis 32 for the full story!

Fencing - Ehud gets the gold medal for this one. This man from Judges 3 delivered God's people from the Moabites with a powerful stroke of the sword that encompassed the blade to the hilt! Plus, being a left-hander no doubt has an extra advantage.

Sport Climbing - Who is the man who climbed many mountains in his lifetime? Who did so without food or water for forty days? Who did so while carrying two stone tablets? Who did so well into his seventies? That would be Moses, taking home the gold medal in that category.

Boxing - OK, so this one might be a bit of a stretch here, but Paul the apostle did refer to boxing in 1 Corinthians 9:26 as he "does not box as one beating the air." He was able to take quite a licking too, receiving a full stoning at Lystra in Acts 14 and still surviving.

Rhythmic Gymnastics - Yeah, another stretch one here, but this one goes to Miriam, the older sister of Moses, who led God's people with song and dancing after the crossing of the Red Sea in Exodus 15.

Equestrian - This might be a tricky one, but it goes to Jesus, who not only was able to ride into Jerusalem on a donkey that had never before been ridden, but also is described as the rider on the white horse in Revelation, bringing in the resurrection victory on the Last Day!

Do you think some Bible athletes could compete in the Bible Olympics that aren't listed here? Or do you have some challengers to these athletes here that might compete for the gold that I didn't mention? Let me know! In the meantime, however, enjoy watching these Olympics.

Monthly Music Minute for July 2024

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

July 1 marks two years since Anna and I moved to Missouri and joined the Holy Cross family. It feels like we've been here forever -- it truly feels like home. Thank you all for making this transition so easy.

While we have loved our time here so far, there have certainly been some things about Missouri that we are still getting used to. Things like the traffic and the heat are adjustments for us who came from rural Indiana and Michigan.

Perhaps the biggest adjustment, though, has been getting used to how long and severe the spring storm season here can be. I have been told that this year was more severe than normal, but even last spring's storms were more frequent and severe than what we might get in the upper Midwest. The consistency of hail, tornadoes, and flooding just doesn't occur where we came from, and so living through some of these storms made me feel quite uneasy at times this spring. There were a couple of moments this spring that, with the hail and wind descending upon our small little house, I genuinely felt afraid.

Thinking about this weather, I was reminded of hymn 743 in our hymnal, the Hymn of the Day for July 14, "Jesus, Priceless Treasure." This hymn has been sung by Lutherans since the 1600's, under the title "Jesu, Meine Freude" — "Jesus, My Joy." It is a hymn found in the "Hope and Comfort" section of the hymnal, and the hymn's six verses are a bold song of faith, talking about Jesus being our support and defense against the devil, the world, and our sinful nature.

I was reminded of this hymn when thinking about the weather because one major metaphor that the hymn uses is equating difficulties in life to severe storms. The second verse, in particular, uses vivid storm imagery to talk about the fears and difficulties of this life:

> "Though the earth be shaking, Every heart be quaking, Jesus calms my fear.

Lightnings flash and thunders crash; Yet, though sin and hell assail me, Jesus will not fail me."

I think the storm imagery in this hymn is helpful because it doesn't sugarcoat the threat that sin, Satan, and hell provide. As Christians, we know that Christ has conquered these things, and so we often shrug them off - and rightfully so! That doesn't mean, though, that the forces of evil are not still out there and are not still working against us. 1 Peter 5:8 says, "Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour." When the storms of life hit, when a loved one suffers a difficult, long-term illness, when a sudden tragedy strikes, these moments can be absolutely terrifying! We can feel utterly helpless. And you had better believe that Satan is trying to use these moments of fear to pounce and steer us away from our reliance on Jesus and his work for us.

But, thanks be to God, Jesus is stronger than Satan. Verses 3-5 of this hymn mock Satan, temptation, and the evil in the world, not because these threats are not real, but because, even in these moments of fear and hardship, Jesus conquers all. After all, who has authority over all things, that even the wind and the waves obey him?

So, whether the storms of life that we fear are Satan, temptation, hardship, bad health, pain, loss, or just genuine severe thunderstorms and tornadoes, we sing the last words of this hymn with confidence:

"Those who love the Father, Though the storms may gather, Still have peace within. Yea, whate'er I here must bear, Thou art still my purest pleasure, Jesus, priceless treasure!"

Even more so, may He always be with you, so that you never need to take a step alone.
