Ecclesia Semper Reformanda

- ✓ Sing "A Mighty Fortress?"
- ✓ Change to red paraments?
- ✓ Mention Martin Luther?

Pe have had the opportunity to celebrate the Reformation on October 26-27 at Holy Cross with the things listed above. These celebrations mark the anniversary of Martin Luther's posting of the 95 Theses on October 31, 1517.

Many things about the Reformation that make it worthy to be celebrated and highlighted are significant. These things are often summarized as the solas of the Reformation. (Sola is the Latin word for "alone".)

Sola Scriptura "Scripture Alone" is one of the solas. This truth emphasizes the emphasis in the era of the Reformation to go back to Scripture, the Word of God, and the Bible as the only source of authority. The Roman Catholic Church at the time saw Scripture as authoritative, but it also saw popes and councils as authoritative. (Think of councils as a gathering of the most important and knowledgeable church people meeting for years to make decisions on doctrine). This sense of authority from the Roman Catholic Church caused some problems, and the Reformers addressed it head-on.

Sola Fide "Faith Alone" is a second sola. This truth emphasizes that **justification** (being declared just and sin-free by God) is received **by faith alone**, and not by any other means. This contrasts with the Roman Catholic Church's emphasis on faith plus works to attain God's justification. Unfortunately, this is still true today in the Roman Catholic church in things such as "confession," when a person is required to do something (e.g. pray the Lord's Prayer ten times) to receive forgiveness. The Reformers tackled this issue directly as well, teaching clearly that justification through Christ alone is 100 percent an action of God for the benefit of each individual.

Sola Gratia "Grace Alone" is a third sola. This truth emphasizes that a person is saved by grace alone.



The Roman Catholic Church at the time taught that grace gave the ability to cooperate with salvation. The Reformers, however, emphasized that grace is purely an action of God which saves individuals fully and completely without any cooperative effort by an individual.

[Note: in addition to these three solas, one to four more solas have been added, depending on the source and branch of Protestantism.]

This is the November issue of the *Koinonia*, and that special Oct. 31 Reformation date has gone already as we head full-steam toward Christmas.

However, one more Latin phrase I would like to share is ever important: *Ecclesia semper reformanda est*. This phrase means "The church is always to be reformed." Attributed to theologian Karl Barth in 1947, this phrase is a continual call for all churches to reexamine themselves to ensure that Jesus Christ and the Christian faith are taught in truth and purity.

And even though the Reformation is now 507 years away from us, it is still a truth that must remain alive and well in the Church today. Satan loves spending time in churches. He loves baiting and luring faithful Christians away from the saving truth of the Gospel. Satan does this craftily by making things disguised as Christianity attractive that but in reality are light years away.

These temptations that Satan throws at us are no different than those exact temptations that were around in the reformation: creating an additional authority (sola Scriptura) and adding human participation to God's work of salvation (sola fide and sola gratia). And so, 500 years later, the Reformation continues to live on as we preach, teach, and receive the message of Christ crucified for you!

Monthly Music Minute for October 2024

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

ere's a pop quiz for all liturgical enthusiasts: How many readings are assigned each Sunday of the church year? No peeking ahead. Do you have your answer?

If you said three, congratulations! You're... wrong. Or, at least, you're not entirely right.

But wait, you may ask. Don't we do three readings each week? The elder reads from the Old Testament and an Epistle, and the pastor reads the Gospel. That's three!

That's true, and most Lutheran churches certainly use those three readings each week. However, there is actually a fourth assigned text for each week--a Psalm, meant to be slotted between the Old Testament and Epistle readings.

You could be forgiven for not remembering the Psalm. After all, we don't utilize the Psalm at every service, and often, when we do, it may take place apart from the readings, serving as the Introit, and spoken responsively instead of read. Many LCMS congregations never even do this, and so the assigned Psalms tend to be forgotten.

I think there are two reasons for this. Firstly, in the Divine Service, it is much more convenient to

omit a Psalm which changes every week than an element like the Creed or the Words of Institution. Secondly, for many congregations, singing is not necessarily a strength. Rather than speaking words meant to be sung, a congregation might omit the Psalm entirely in favor of a more familiar hymn.

You may recall, however, that the Psalms are Scripture's hymnal. The word "psalm" literally means "praises." Psalms are a blessing. They are God's Word, and they are intended to be sung!

Over the past few months, we at Holy Cross have made a concerted effort on Sundays to sing the Psalms with more consistency. Practically, we have been able to do so because of musical pastors who are willing to lead, a choir that is very devoted, and a congregation that sings boldly. Keep it up!

While we may not sing this fourth "forgotten" reading every week, depending on what else might be happening in the service, we will continue singing the hymns from Scripture's hymnal. After all, what better hymns to sing than the ones God gave His people to sing throughout time?


