## Quality AND Quantity

*"Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons." ~ John 2:6*

Quantity and Quality. Usually, you have one or the other but not both. This is most especially true for the things we eat and drink.

I am a lucky man who has eaten many high-quality, wonderfully delectable homemade desserts by my wife over the years. These individually baked goods pale compared to the mass-produced treats and desserts in grocery stores.

At other times, I've been at a handful of wedding receptions where I am sure that top dollar has been paid out for a meal that needs to serve hundreds of guests. Rarely does it measure or even come close to something that would be made at home.

In the Epiphany season that takes up most of January, we consider Jesus' first miracle of changing water into wine at Cana in Galilee. Find this sign (as the Gospel of John describes it) in John chapter 2.

One of the things that strikes me every time about this miracle is that Jesus brings with Him both quality AND quantity. He doesn't do just one at the expense of the other – He does both!

Let's look at the quantity first. The John 2 text says that "six stone water pots" were there and adds that each can hold "two or three metretas."

How much exactly were "two to three metretas?" Scholars estimate that 2 metretas would equal 78.8 liters, or 20.8 US gallons. Three metretas, therefore, would be 118.2 liters, or 31.2 US gallons. To give you a better visual of these, 20 gallons is the size of a stainless steel trash can, like the one in which Oscar the Grouch from Sesame Street lives. Our gym at those trash cans and see several 32-gallon bins that fill up quickly after our potluck meals. Don't forget that six of those trash can-sized containers are filled to the brim with water! The total amounts here would be between 472.8 liters and 709.2 liters, equal to 124 gallons and 187.2 gallons!

If we look at what the equivalent would be with wine bottles, it's even more staggering. A standard-size bottle of wine holds 750 mL of wine. Since we are looking at between 472.8 and 709.2 liters, that would

be the equivalent of 630.4 bottles of wine and 945.6 bottles of wine!

The quantity of wine that we are talking about would, in today's society, need to be specially ordered and delivered via forklift on a loading palate! Talk about a miracle of quantity!

Again, what makes Jesus' miracle so is that it has quantity AND quality.

This isn't some mass-produced box wine either; the wine taster described it as the "best he had ever tasted!" I am sure that this wine taster had already sampled countless glasses of wine before in his life. He had seen it all, the sweets, the bitters, the reds, the whites, the good, the bad, and the awful. When I read John 2 and hear someone with that level of experience share that it's the "best he had ever tasted," that is a "Wow!" moment for me for sure!

The wonderful thing about this episode in John chapter 2 is that Jesus refers to it as a "sign." I like the term that the author John uses here because signs always point to something. As we hear about the sign of Jesus turning water into wine, it points to God and His blessings to us. It points to us receiving from God blessings in both quantity AND quality!

As for quantity, I think of the massively staggering number of sins I have committed. That Jesus Christ forgave every last one of them with His death on the cross and His resurrection from the grave is remarkable!

As for the quality, we all received gifts of varying qualities at Christmas just a few weeks ago. However, we have the highest-quality gifts of God coming to us today through His Holy Spirit. These gifts are of the highest quality imaginable – they will never spoil, break, fade, or tarnish. They will last forever!

It's rare for the blessings in life to have both quality AND quantity. But Jesus Christ demonstrates that we are the recipients of a gift that has both! May you live in the quality and quantity of Jesus' forgiveness, life, and salvation today and every day!

# Monthly Music Minute for January 2025

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

One of the greatest treasures of the Lutheran musical tradition is the chorale. In its simplest form, the chorale is a hymn tune and its harmonization. The chorale started when Martin Luther translated hymns from Latin into German, the language of the people. As part of this project, he also decided to take many of the difficult chant tunes and simplify them into more singable melodies, all to encourage greater participation of the congregation in worship. Almost all of the hymns we sing (and certainly all that we sing with German heritage) are chorales - A Mighty Fortress, O Sacred Head Now Wounded, Savior of the Nations Come, and so many more come to mind.

Epiphany, which we will celebrate at Holy Cross the weekend of January 4-5, is coming up, and the assigned Hymn of the Day for Epiphany is a chorale sometimes referred to as "The Queen of Chorales," Philipp Nicolai's "O Morning Star, How Fair and Bright."

From 1597-1598, a devastating plague struck Nicolai's community, with the worst week having 170 deaths, and, being the pastor, Nicolai found himself burying many of the town's inhabitants. During this period, he prepared his *Frewden-Spiegel dess ewigen Lebens* ("Joyful Mirror of the Eternal Life"), a collection of meditations and three hymns, with Nicolai writing for the purpose "to leave behind me (if God should call me from this world) as a token of my peaceful, joyful, Christian departure, or (if God should spare me in health) to comfort other sufferers whom He should also visit with the pestilence."

We don't know if Nicolai wrote many other chorales, but two of the three in this collection are beloved by Lutherans around the world today. In addition to the aforementioned "Queen of Chorales," Nicolai also included what has been dubbed the "King of Chorales", the End Times hymn, "Wake, Awake, for Night is Flying."

Let's return to the chorale at hand, though, "O Morning Star, How Fair and Bright (LSB 395)" At Epiphany, we might be drawn to think of the star guiding the wise men to Bethlehem, but the Morning Star in this hymn refers to a far greater light, Christ himself, who refers to himself in Revelation 22:16 as "the bright and morning star."

Stanzas 5 and 6 of the chorale, in particular, are, for my money, some of the greatest hymn stanzas in all of our hymnody, and a great reason why this might be rightfully called the "Queen of Chorales." The text's ability (especially in the context of Nicolai's difficulties) to express the joyful expectation of eternity in the very presence of Jesus, the true Morning Star, the very Light of the World, is unmatched. I'll leave you today to ponder these two stanzas and the comfort these words might have for

O let the harps break forth in sound!  
Our joy be all with music crowned,  
Our voices gladly blending!  
For Christ goes with us all the way—  
Today, tomorrow, ev'ry day!  
His love is never ending!  
Sing out! Ring out!  
Jubilation! Exultation!  
Tell the story!  
Great is He, the King of Glory!

What joy to know, when life is past,  
The Lord we love is first and last,  
The end and the beginning!  
He will one day, oh, glorious grace,  
Transport us to that happy place  
Beyond all tears and sinning!  
Amen! Amen!  
Come, Lord Jesus!  
Crown of gladness!  
We are yearning  
For the day of Your returning!

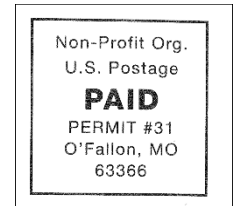
