
People of the Passion: BARABBAS

He is a man known for insurrection and murder -- a criminal awaiting a death sentence. And yet, when this reading is finished, he walks away a free man because Jesus has officially been condemned to death in his place.

I have found in him no guilt deserving death. I will therefore punish and release him." ²³But they were urgent, demanding with loud cries that he should be crucified. And their voices prevailed. ²⁴So Pilate decided that their demand should be granted. ²⁵He released the man who had been thrown into prison for insurrection and murder, for whom they asked, but he delivered Jesus over to their will.



The congregation's response may begin just as the leader's petition ends so that the word "Lord" is sung simultaneously by both leader and congregation.




